20 All Saints, Ellington, Cambridgeshire. Restored wings on a life-size robed Angel.



21 All Saints, Elm, Cambridgeshire. Small damaged Angel with broken wings.



22 St. Bartholomew, Great Gransden, Cambridgeshire. A small winged Angel carrying a wreath or crown of thorns.



23 All Saints, Huntingdon, Cambridgeshire. The restored and re-painted Chancel Roof with a full-length gilded Angel and small Angels on the crossbeams.



24 St. Andrew, Kimbolton, Cambridgeshire. An Angel with a missing wing in the South Chapel, and small Angels on the wall-plate at his feet.



25 All Saints, Landbeach, Cambridgeshire. A small wingless Angel clasps a large heart to his breast.



26 St. Mary, Madingley, Cambridgeshire. Damaged remnants of wooden Roof Angels.



27 All Saints, Tilbrook, Cambridgeshire. A wingless Angel holds a wreath or crown of thorns in the North Aisle.



28 St. Mary Magdalene, Gedney, Lincolnshire. One small remaining Roof Angel surrounded by large elaborate bosses.



29 St. Mary, Pinchbeck, Lincolnshire. A brightly-gilded Angel on the Nave Roof.



30 St. Edmund, Emneth, Norfolk. An example of an arch braced tie-beam Roof with full-length Angels with folded wings along the sides and demi-Angels with outstretched wings on the tie-beams.



31 St. Michael-at-Plea, Norwich, Norfolk. Angels perched on the Roof ridge.
